

Through his Word we find freedom and peace for our thinking, because it is not that we have no problem or that they end immediately, but that God gives us the strength to resist, the wisdom to resolve and freedom through His Word.

All we have to do is trust what Jesus tells us if we want to be free from our negative emotions in our lives and let the peace and love of God always rein in us.

World Communion Sunday today:

The United Methodist Church celebrates World Communion Sunday with congregations all over the globe. Followers of Jesus Christ in large churches and small, on farms and in cities, in ornate buildings and under tents, gather to receive the bread and cup of Holy Communion.

Some will receive cubes of bread. Some will tear from a common loaf. Some will receive a wafer.

Some will drink from a common chalice. Some will dip a piece of bread into the cup. Some will have individual glasses. Some will use wine; some juice. Some will offer both.

Pastors will lead a variety of liturgies, in many languages. Clergy will dress


traditionally, formally, and casually.




